	Aims	Content
1. 15 April 2021	To understand how The Forbes School of painting influenced a generation of artists	The Forbes School of painting (1899 – 1939) We look at the influence of Stanhope and Elizabeth Forbes as art teachers and some of the many artists they taught. The Forbes School instigated a second generation of Newlyn artists many of them stayed in Cornwall including Dod and Ernest Procter, Robert and Eleanor Hughes, Jill and Geoffrey Garnier, Frank and Jessica Heath, and many more.
2. 22 April	To look at the work of the artist and understand his place in the Newlyn School	Harold Harvey - A Cornish painter and friends, Harold Harvey who was born in Penzance, had a large output of work through his life of colourful, domestic and Cornish scenes. His wife Gertrude Harvey was also a painter and this lecture looks at both artists work.
3 29 April	To look at the life and career of these artists and understand their work	Dod Procter RA and Ernest Procter – A Cornish Romance Dod Procter née Shaw RA (1890 – 1972) and Ernest Procter (1886 – 1935)
4. 6 May	To look at these two artistic couples and their work.	Famous Husbands and Talented Wives – Ruth Simpson née Alison (1889 - 1964) and Charles Simpson (1885 – 1971) and Jill Garnier née Blythe (1890 - 1966) and Geoffrey Garnier (1889 – 1970)
5. 13 May	To look at this prolific artist's work and those he influenced	Samuel John Lamorna Birch RA (1869 – 1955) A Leader in Cornish Landscape painting and his followers including Garstin Cox, John Nobel Barlow.
6. 20 May	To look at the time spent by these artists in Cornwall and how they collaborated.	Love Art and Tragedy: Close Encounters in a Cornish Art Colony We look at the art created by Laura and Harold Knight, and Alfred Munnings while in Cornwall and the relationships they had with resident artists such as Ella Naper set against the tragedy of the <i>Summer in February</i> story.
7. 3 June	To look at some of the many artists who lived in the Lamorna Valley (1895-1950)	Life in Lamorna : Artists of the Lamorna valley including Frank Gascoigne Heath, Robert and Eleanor Hughes, Stanley Gardiner and Richard 'Seal' Weatherby, Gluck, Ithell Colquhoun, Marlow Moss etc.
8. 10 June 2021	To look at the work made for St. Hilary Church by Newlyn artists.	Art in a Cornish Church: Annie Walke and the artists who made paintings for St. Hilary Church including Annie Walke, Harold Harvey, Ernest Procter etc.
